Topic

We made new panels.

We created 4 new panels for the panel exhibition to be held from April. From this time, we would like to introduce them little by little.

This time, the question is "Did CO2 emissions decrease due to the influence of the new corona? (1)".

When the new coronavirus began to spread in 2019, it was predicted that annual CO2 emissions would be reduced by about 7% if movement restrictions were maintained to some extent. According to the IEA (World Energy Agency) announcement, global CO2 emissions in 2020 decreased by 6.4% compared to 2019.

We would like to be happy that it decreased almost as expected, but it seems necessary to pay attention to the difference in the extent of the decrease depending on the country. In contrast to the 8.8% decrease in the United States, there was almost no decrease at 0.9% in China and 1.5% in Russia. Japan decreased by 3.7%.

When restrictions on economic activity began, it was said that even if the coronavirus epidemic subsided, instead of returning to the original economic activity, it was necessary to create an industrial structure that suppressed CO2 emissions. It seems that it was not.
